ORDER DENYING REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSE

On November 30, 2009, in Case No. H-2329 FR, an Order was executed which accepted the petition for the voluntary surrender of the real estate broker license of Respondent. The Order became effective on December 21, 2009.

On March 10, 2017, Respondent petitioned for reinstatement of said real estate broker license, and the Attorney General of the State of California has been given notice of the filing of said petition.

The burden of proving rehabilitation rests with the petitioner (Feinstein v. State Bar (1952) 39 Cal. 2d 541). A petitioner is required to show greater proof of honesty and integrity than an applicant for first time licensure. The proof must be sufficient to overcome the prior adverse judgment on the applicant's character (Tardiff v. State Bar (1980) 27 Cal. 3d 395).

I have considered the petition of Respondent and the evidence submitted in support thereof.

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1	The Bureau has developed criteria in Section 2911 of Title 10, California Code of
2	Regulations (Regulations) to assist in evaluating the rehabilitation of an applicant for
3	reinstatement of a license. Among the criteria relevant in this proceeding are:
4	Regulation 2911(j) Discharge of, or bona fide efforts toward discharging,
5	adjudicated debts or monetary obligations to others.
6	Petitioner has an outstanding Recovery Account Judgment in the amount of
7	\$50,000.00 and has made no attempt to repay or set up a payment plan, respectively.
8	Respondent has failed to demonstrate to my satisfaction that Respondent has
9	undergone sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the reinstatement of Respondent's real estate
10	broker license at this time.
11	Given the violations found and the fact that Respondent has not established that
12	Respondent has satisfied Regulations 2911(j), I am not satisfied that Respondent is sufficiently
13	rehabilitated to receive a real estate broker license.
14	NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent's petition for
15	reinstatement of Respondent's real estate broker license is denied. JAN 2 6 2018
