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rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the

California Business and Professions Code ("Code") as a real estate broker.

3.

(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

On or about May 18, 2013, in the Superior Court for the State of California, County of San Diego, in Case No. CD 243284, Respondent was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 532(a) [Obtaining Property/Labor/Services by False Pretenses], a felony reduced to a misdemeanor pursuant to Penal Code Section 17b; and Business and Professions Code Section 17533.7(a) [Solicitation Falsely Indicating Government Connection], a misdemeanor. The underlying facts of these crimes bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

4.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3, above, constitute cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

Code Section 10106 provides in pertinent part that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed

the reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement of the case.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent SUZETTE JACKSON under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code), for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by Code Section 10106, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
