15	The Complainant, TRICIA D. SOMMERS, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner
16	of the State of California, for cause of Accusation against HERMAN MICHAEL
17	CAVARRUBIAS (Respondent), is informed and alleges as follows:
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19	Complainant makes this Accusation against Respondent in her official capacity.
20	2
21	Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate
22	Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code (the Code) as a real estate
23	broker.
24	3
25	On or about May 4, 2009, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County
26	of Santa Clara, Case no. 211048, Respondent was convicted of 2 counts of violating Section
27	470(d) of the California Penal Code (Forgery Instrument Other Than Check), and 19 counts of
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1	violating Section 484/487(a) of the California Penal Code (Grand Theft), with enhancements	
2	pursuant to Section 186.11(a) (1)/(a) (2) of the California Penal Code (Multiple Fraud	
3	Convictions) and Section 12022.6(a) (4) of the California Penal Code (Damages Arising Out Of	
4	Felony Exceeding \$3.2 Million), each a felony and crime which bear a substantial relationship	
5	under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or	
6	duties of a real estate licensee.	
7	4	
8	On or about July 25, 2012, the Court of Appeal of the State of California, Sixth	
. 9	Appellate Division, Case No. H 034263, the Court, after hearing an appeal of Case No. 211048,	
10	set forth above, vacated the Trial Court's amended judgment awarding additional conduct credits	
11	and reinstated the original judgment.	
12	5	
13	The facts alleged in Paragraph 3 and 4, above, constitute cause under Section	
14	10177(b) (Further Grounds for Disciplinary Action-Conviction of Crime) and Section 490	
15	(Conviction Substantially Related Crime) of the Code for suspension or revocation of	
16	Respondent's license under the Real Estate Law.	
17	6	
18	Section 10106 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued	
19	in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the department, the commissioner may request	
20	the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part	
21	to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.	
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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a Decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Code, for the reasonable cost of investigation and prosecution of this case, including agency attorney's fees and for such other and further relief as may be proper under provisions of law.
