23	Respondent made application to the Bureau for a real estate salesperson license
24	on or about May 13, 2013.

26	On or about October 29, 2007, in the Superior Court of the State of
27	California, County of Riverside, Case No. INF058589, Respondent was convicted of violating

Section 11360(B) of the California Health & Safety Code (transport/sale of marijuana), a felony, and a crime that bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, of the California Code of Regulations ("the Code"), to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about February 23, 2001, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Butte, Case No. NCR86487, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 602.5 of the California Penal Code (trespassing), a misdemeanor, and a crime that bears a substantial relationship under the Code to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about February 1, 2001, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of San Joaquin, Case No. MM101107A, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 20002(a) of the California Vehicle Code (hit and run with property damage), a misdemeanor, and a crime that bears a substantial relationship under the Code to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

## PRIOR ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

Effective April 6, 2010, in Case No. H-5282 SAC, Respondent's prior application for a real estate salesperson license was denied by the Real Estate Commissioner pursuant to Sections 480(a) (conviction of crime) and 10177(b) (conviction of crime) of the Code.

Respondent's criminal convictions, described in Paragraphs 3 through 5, above, constitute cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license pursuant to the provisions of Section 480(a) and 10177(b) of the Code.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under the provisions of the law.
