

DECISION AFTER DEFAULT

This Decision is being issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 11520 of the Government Code, on evidence of compliance with Section 11505 of the Government Code and pursuant to the Order of Default filed on August 15, 1997, and the findings of fact set forth herein are based on one or more of the following: (1) respondent's express admissions; (2) affidavits; and (3) other evidence.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- (a) On July 22, 1997, Thomas Mc Crady made the Accusation in his official capacity as a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California. The Accusation, Statement to Respondent, and Notice of Defense were mailed, by certified mail, to respondent's last known mailing address on file with the Department on July 22, 1997.
- (b) The above documents were returned by the Post Office marked "Forwarding Order Expired".
- (c) On August 15, 1997, no Notice of Defense having been filed herein within the time prescribed by Section 11506 of the Government Code, respondent's default was entered herein.

At all times mentioned herein, KENNETH SHIGENORI HAYASHI, (Respondent) was and still is licensed by the Department of Real Estate of the State of California ("Department") as a real estate broker.

III

On or about September 22, 1994, in the United States Bankruptcy Court, Central District of California, in Case No. LA 91-82659-GM, Adv. No. 93-02350-WL, a judgment was entered against Respondent based on grounds of fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit with reference to a transaction for which a real estate license is required. On January 26, 1996, the United States Bankruptcy Appellate Panel of the Ninth Circuit District upheld the bankruptcy court's decision. Said judgment is now final.

TV

The license of Respondent was suspended indefinitely on April 25, 1996, per Recovery Fund Case No. R-2902.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

1.

The facts set forth in Finding III constitute cause under Section 10177.5 of the Business and Professions Code for suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

ORDER

The license and license rights of KENNETH SHIGENORI HAYASHI under the provisions of Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code are revoked.



On or about September 22, 1994, in the United States Bankruptcy Court, Central District of California, in Case No. LA 91-82659-GM, Adv. No. 93-02350- WL, a judgment was entered against Respondent based on grounds of fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit with reference to a transaction for which a real estate license is required. On January 26, 1996, the United States Bankruptcy Appellate Panel of the Ninth Circuit District upheld the bankruptcy court's decision. Said judgment is now final.

IV

The facts set forth in Paragraph III constitute cause under Section 10177.5 of the Business and Professions Code for suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

The license of Respondent was suspended indefinitely on April 25, 1996, per Recovery Fund Case No. R-2902.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all licenses and/or license rights of KENNETH SHIGENORI HAYASHI under the Real Estate Law and for such other and further relief as may be proper under applicable provisions of law.
