DECISION

DEPARTMENT OF REAL ESTATE

This Decision is being issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 11520 of the Government Code, on evidence of compliance with Section 11505 of the Government Code and pursuant to the Order of Default filed on June 2, 2011, and the findings of fact set forth herein are based on one or more of the following: (1) Respondent's express admissions; (2) affidavits; and (3) other evidence.

This Decision revokes a real estate license on grounds of the conviction of a crime.

The right to reinstatement of a revoked real estate license or to the reduction of a suspension is controlled by Section 11522 of the Government Code. A copy of Section 11522 and a copy of the Commissioner's <u>Criteria of Rehabilitation</u> are attached hereto for the information of Respondent.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

1.

On June 17, 2010, Joseph D. Aiu made the Accusation in his official capacity as a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California. The Accusation, Statement to Respondent, and Notice of Defense were mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, to Respondent at her address of record on June 24, 2010. On or about June 26, 2010, the certified mail return receipt was signed and returned to the Department of Real Estate.

On June 1, 2011, no Notice of Defense having been filed herein within the time prescribed by Section 11506 of the Government Code, Respondent's default was entered herein.

2.

Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code, as a real estate salesperson. Respondent was originally issued a real estate salesperson license by the Department on May 3, 2004.

3.

On or about September 3, 2009, Respondent was convicted of violating Health and Safety Code Section 11351(Possession of Cocaine for Sale), a felony.

4.

The evidence established that the crime of which Respondent was convicted, as set forth above, is substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of a real estate licensee.

### DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

1.

Cause for disciplinary action against Respondent exists pursuant to Business and Professions Code Sections  $\underline{490}$  and  $\underline{10177(b)}$ .

2.

The standard of proof applied was clear and convincing proof to a reasonable certainty.

ACCUSATION

Respondent.

The Complainant, Joseph D. Aiu, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, acting in his official capacity, for cause of Accusation against CHRISTINA MAGANA, ("Respondent") alleges as follows:

1.

Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate salesperson.

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2.

(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

On or about September 3, 2009, in the Superior Court of California, County of Riverside, in Case No. INF064908, Respondent was convicted of violating Health and Safety Code Section 11351 (Possession of Cocaine for Sale), a felony. crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

3.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as described above, constitutes cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Business & Professions Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent, CHRISTINA MAGANA, under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code) and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
