Crystal Carter 18 ("Respondent"), alleges as follows: 19 1. 20 The Complainant, Robin Trujillo, a Deputy Real Estate 21 Commissioner of the State of California, makes this Accusation 22 in her official capacity. 23 2. 24 Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license 25 rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the 26

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California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate salesperson.

3.

On or about November 3, 2010, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. BA373476, Respondent pled nolo contendere and was convicted of: (7) seven counts for violation of Penal Code Section 459 (burglary), a misdemeanor, and (2) two counts for violation of Penal Code Section 496(A) (receiving stolen property), a misdemeanor. Respondent was sentenced to 36 months probation, 45 days of Cal Trans/ graffiti removal, and ordered to pay fines. In addition, Respondent was ordered to stay at least 100 yards away from the Santee Alley area.

4.

These convictions, by their facts and circumstances, bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted constitutes cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

6.

Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department of Real Estate, the Commissioner may

request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case. /// /// /// /// /// 7// /// /// /// /// /// /// 

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all licenses and license rights of Respondent CRYSTAL LESLIE CARTER under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code), for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other provisions of law.
