Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code as a real estate salesperson.

(GUILTY PLEA)~

District Court, Central District of California, in Case No. CR

12-640-DDP, Respondent pled quilty to violating 18 U.S.S.

§1343 (wire fraud), a felony.

On or about October 10, 2012, in the United States

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(FAILURE TO REPORT)

Respondent did not report in writing to the

Department of Real Estate ("Department"), the bringing of the indictment charging the aforementioned felony against her, within 30 days of the bringing of the indictment (filed July 10, 2012); neither did Respondent report in writing to the Department her plea of guilty to the aforementioned felony (entered October 10, 2012). Respondent's failure to report the indictment and/or guilty plea constitutes cause for discipline

under Business and Professions Code Section 10186.21 of the

1 Pursuant to Business and Professions Code 10186.2: (a)(1) A licensee shall report any of the following to the department: (A) The bringing of an indictment or information charging a felony against the licensee. (B) The conviction of the licensee, including any verdict of guilty, or plea of guilty or no contest, of any felony or misdemeanor. (c) Any disciplinary action taken by another licensing entity or authority of this state or of another state or an agency of the federal government. (2) The report required by this subdivision shall be made in writing within 30 days of the date of the bringing of the indictment or the charging of a felony, the

California Business and Professions Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the department, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement of the case.
