(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

2.

On or about February 28, 2012, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. 1CP09121, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Section 23152(b)(Driving with Blood Alcohol Above 0.08%), a misdemeanor. This crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

(IN AGGRAVATION)

3.

In aggravation, on or about July 10, 2009, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. 9MP06647, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Section 12500(a)(Driving Without a Valid License), a misdemeanor. This crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

4.

In aggravation, on or about June 19, 2007, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. 7MP01826, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Sections 23152(b)(Driving with Blood Alcohol Above 0.08%), and 14601.2(a) (Driving While License Suspended by DUI), both misdemeanors. These crimes are substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

5.

In aggravation, on or about July 26, 2006, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. 6MP05226, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Section 23152(b)(Driving with Blood Alcohol Above 0.08%), a misdemeanor. This crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

On or about July 16, 2003, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. 3SE04045, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Section 23152(b)(Driving with Blood Alcohol Above 0.08%), a misdemeanor. This crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as described above, constitute cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Business & Professions Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

California Business and Professions Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement of the case.
