#### DECISION

This Decision is being issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 11520 of the Government Code, on evidence of compliance with Section 11505 of the Government Code and pursuant to the Order of Default filed on July 25, 2014, and the findings of fact set forth herein are based on one or more of the following: (1) Respondent's express admissions; (2) affidavits; and (3) other evidence.

This Decision suspends or revokes one or more real estate licenses on the ground of the conviction of a crime.

The right to reinstatement of a revoked real estate license or to the reduction of a suspension is controlled by Section 11522 of the Government Code. A copy of Section 11522 and a copy of the Commissioner's <u>Criteria of Rehabilitation</u> are attached hereto for the information of Respondent.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

Ι

On April 9, 2014, Robin Trujillo made the Accusation in her official capacity as a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California. The Accusation, Statement to Respondent, and Notice of Defense were mailed, by certified mail, to Respondent's last known mailing address on file with the Bureau on April 24, 2014.

Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within the time required by Section 11506 of the Government Code. Respondent's default was entered on July 25, 2014.

ΙI

Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code (Code) as a real estate broker.

On or about November 27, 2012, in the Superior Court for the State of California, County of Kern, in Case No. BF139102, Respondent was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 182(A)(1) [Conspiracy to Commit Crime of Grand Theft], a felony. The underlying facts of this crime bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as described, above, constitutes cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

## DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

Ι

The evidence established that the crime(s) of which Respondent was convicted is substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of a real estate licensee. Cause for disciplinary action against Respondent exists pursuant to Business and Professions Code Sections 490 and 10177(b).

ΙI

The standard of proof applied was clear and convincing proof to a reasonable certainty.

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### ORDER

The licenses and license rights of Respondent JAY EDWARD LANGNER under the provisions of Part I of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code are revoked.
