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- 1	A CCTICATION OF

(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

3.

On or about November 6, 2014, in the Superior Court of California, County of Santa Barbara, Case No. 1453657, Respondent pled *nolo contendere* to and was convicted for violation of California Penal Code Section 273.5(a) (corporal injury to cohabitant), a felony. Respondent was placed on supervised probation for 5 years and ordered to serve 120 days in county jail and to pay various fines and fees. In addition, Respondent was ordered to complete a one-year batterer's intervention program and 20 hours of public service work. This conviction bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

4.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitutes cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

(FAILURE TO REPORT CONVICTION)

5.

Pursuant to Section 10186.2 of the Code, a licensee shall report, in writing, "the conviction of the licensee, including any verdict of guilty, or plea of guilty or no contest, of any felony or misdemeanor" to the Bureau within 30 days of the conviction. Respondent failed to report in writing to the Bureau the conviction described in Paragraph 3 above, within thirty (30) days of the conviction date.

6.

Respondent's failure to timely report the conviction described in Paragraph 3, above, constitutes cause under Section 10186.2 of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

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ACCUSATION OF ANGELO GABRIEL NAEMI

(COSTS OF INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT)

California Business and Professions Code Section 10106, provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent ANGELO GABRIEL NAEMI under the Real Estate Law for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
