Accusation of David Moskowitz

Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate broker.

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On or about February 2, 2016, Respondent pled nolo contendere and was convicted in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 5BR04023, for violation of California Penal Code Section 243(e)(1) (Battery), a misdemeanor. Respondent was placed on 36 months of summary probation, and ordered to pay fines and fees. Additionally, Respondent was ordered to perform 44 days of community labor and to complete

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a 52 week domestic violence treatment program.

The conviction described in Paragraph 3 bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitutes cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b)(1) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of all the licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

6.

Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent DAVID MOSKOWITZ under the Real Estate Law, for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
