On or about October 3, 2016, Respondent pled guilty and was convicted in the United States District Court, Central District of California, Case No. CR 14-448-MWF, for violation of five counts of Title 18 of the United States Code Sections 1014 and 2 (False Statement To Financial Institution and Aiding and Abetting), a felony. Respondent was placed on five years of supervised release, and ordered to serve 24 months in prison and pay fees.

4.

The convictions described in Paragraph 3 bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitute cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b)(1) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of all the licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

6.

Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.
