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3. On March 29, 2012, in Case No. H-36791 LA, an Order was issued revoking Respondent's broker license, with the right to a restricted broker license. The restricted license was issued on June 21, 2012. The license was restricted due to trust account shortages, commingling of trust funds with other funds, and failure to maintain accurate and complete trust account records.

- 4. On or about August 2, 2017, Respondent filed with the Bureau of Real Estate a Mortgage Loan Originator Endorsement Application.
- 5. Questions (K) (4), (5), (9), and (M) were answered No by Respondent. The proper answer would have been yes. The questions required disclosure of any order entered against Respondent in connection with a financial services-related activity, any revocation of Respondent's license, any order concerning any license, and any state or federal action taken against an organization controlled by Respondent.
- 6. The matters alleged in Paragraphs 4 and 5 are grounds to suspend or revoke Respondent's real estate license and license rights under Sections 10166.05, 10166.051(b), 10177(a), of the California Business and Professions Code and Section 2945.2, Title 10, Chapter 6 of California Administrative Code.

Business and Professions Code Section 10106

provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in

resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau, the

Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a

licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action on the license and license rights of Respondent LEONEL ACEVES, for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code) and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
