8	RES license. The Decision adopted the proposed decision issued by the Administrative Law
9	Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearing (OAH No. 2018120153) to deny Respondent's
10	application, after a hearing was held on the merits.

8	sentence and placed Respondent on informal probation for 3 years under certain terms and
9	conditions, including, in part, 2 days Cal. Trans., stay away from victim, and payment of fines
10	and fees.
