In aggravation, on or about September 16, 1997, Respondent pled nolo contendere and was convicted in the Superior Court of California, County of Kern, Case No. BM548217A, for violation of California Vehicle Code Section 23103.5(a) (Plea To Reckless Driving In Lieu of DUI), a misdemeanor. Respondent was placed on three years of summary probation, and ordered to serve two days in jail and pay fines and fees.

4.

On or about November 12, 2015, Respondent pled nolo contendere and was convicted in the Superior Court of California, County of Kern, Case No. BM870593A, for violation of California Vehicle Code Section 23152(a) (Driving Under The Influence), a misdemeanor, and Vehicle Code Section 20002(a) (Hit And Run), a misdemeanor. Respondent was placed on three years of probation, and ordered to serve 15 days in jail and pay restitution, fines and fees.

5.

The convictions described in Paragraph 4 bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

6. .

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 4 above, constitute cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of all the licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

7.

Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent JAVIER ESPARZA under the Real Estate Law, for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
