15	The Complainant, RUBEN CORONADO, acting in his official capacity as a	
16	Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, for this Accusation against BRIAN	
17	EUGENE BENNETT ("Respondent"), is informed and alleges as follows:	
18	1	
19	Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate	
20	Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real	
21	estate salesperson.	
22	2	
23	On or about March 13, 2024, Respondent submitted a salesperson renewal	
24	application to the Department of Real Estate ("Department").	
25	3	
26	In response to Question 13 of said salesperson renewal application to wit: "ARE	
27	THERE CRIMINAL CHARGES PENDING AGAINST YOU AT THIS TIME, OR ARE YOU	

1	CURRENTLY AWAITING JUDGMENT AND SENTENCING FOLLOWING ENTRY OF A	
2	PLEA OR JURY VERDICT? IF YES, COMPLETE ITEM 18," Respondent concealed and	
3	failed to disclose the pending charges described below in paragraph 4.	
4	4	
5	On or about April 10, 2023, in the Superior Court of the State of California,	
6	County of Orange, Case No. 23HM02798, Respondent was charged with violating Sections	
7	20002(a) (hit and run with property damage), 23152(a) (driving under the influence), and	
8	23152(b) (driving under the influence-over .08%) of the Vehicle Code, misdemeanors. The	
9	charges against Respondent were disposed of on March 14, 2024.	
10	5	
11	On or about March 14, 2024, in the Superior Court of the State of California,	
12	County of Orange, Case No. 23HM02798, Respondent was convicted of violating Sections	
13	20002(a), 23152(a), and 23152(b) of the Vehicle Code, misdemeanors and crimes that bear a	
14	substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee pursuar	
15	to Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, of the California Code of Regulations.	
16	6	
17	On June 24, 2025, a diligent search was made of the records of the Department of	
18	Real Estate ("Department") relating to Respondent's real estate salesperson license No.	
19	01276203. No record or written notice was received within 30 days from Respondent notifying	
20	the Department, in writing, of any conviction, license disciplinary action, criminal complaint,	
21	information, or indictment charging a felony.	
22	GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINE	
23	7	
24	The facts alleged in Paragraphs 5, above, constitute cause under Sections 490	
25	(conviction of substantially related crime), 10177(b) (conviction of substantially related crime),	
26	and 10177(j) (engaged in conduct that constitutes fraud or dishonest dealing) of the Code for	
27		

the suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

Respondent's failure to report the conviction to the Department, as described in Paragraph 4, above, violates Section 10186.2 (a) (conviction reporting requirements) of the Code, and constitutes cause under Section 10177(d) (willful disregard or violation of Real Estate Law) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

The facts alleged in Paragraphs 2, 3, and 4, above, constitute cause under Sections 498 (license secured by fraud, deceit or knowing misrepresentation) and 10177(a) (attempt to procure a license renewal by fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

MATTER IN AGGRAVATION

On or about March 9, 2021, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 0BL05721, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 23152(b) of the Vehicle Code, a misdemeanor.

COST RECOVERY

The Department will seek to recover the costs of the investigation and prosecution of this case pursuant to Section 10106 of the Code which provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law, for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other provisions of law.
