DECISION

This Decision is being issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 11520 of the Government Code, on evidence of compliance with Section 11505 of the Government Code and pursuant to the Order of Default filed on July 13, 2011, and the findings of fact set forth herein, which are based on one or more of the following: (1) Respondent's express admissions; (2) affidavits; and (3) other evidence.

This Decision revokes a real estate license on grounds of the conviction of crimes.

The right to reinstatement of a revoked real estate license is controlled by Section 11522 of the Government Code. A copy of Section 11522 and a copy of the Commissioner's Criteria of Rehabilitation are attached hereto for the information of Respondent ANTON ALERIC EWING (hereinafter "Respondent").

FINDINGS OF FACT

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On April 22, 2011, Joseph Aiu filed the Accusation in his official capacity as a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California. The Accusation, Statement to Respondent, and Notice of Defense were mailed, by certified mail, return receipt requested, to Respondent's last known mailing address on file with the Department on April 22, 2011 and May 11, 2011.

On July 13, 2011, no Notice of Defense having been received or filed herein within the time prescribed by Section 11506 of the Government Code, Respondent's default was entered herein.

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Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code) (hereinafter "Code") as a real estate broker.

On approximately November 10, 2010, in the United States District Court, Southern District of California, Respondent was convicted of 18 U.S.C. section 1962(d) (conspiracy to conduct enterprise affairs through a pattern of racketeering activity), a felony and a crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

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On approximately November 19, 2010, in the Superior Court, County of San Diego, State of California, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 646.99(a) of the California Penal Code (stalking), a felony and a crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

Cause of disciplinary action against Respondent exists with reference to the convictions set out in Paragraphs 3 and 4, above, pursuant to Business and Professions Code Sections 490 (Conviction of Crime) and 10177(b) (Conviction of Crime Substantially Related to Qualifications, Functions or Duties of Real Estate Licensee).

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The standard of proof applied was clear and convincing proof to a reasonable certainty.

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ORDER

All licenses and licensing rights of Respondent ANTON ALERIC EWING under the provisions of Part I of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code are revoked.
