DECISION

This Decision is being issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 11520 of the Government Code, on evidence of compliance with Section 11505 of the Government Code and pursuant to the Order of Default filed on February 1, 2012, and the findings of fact set forth herein, which are based on one or more of the following: (1) Respondent's express admissions; (2) affidavits; and (3) other evidence.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1

On December 15, 2011, Joseph Aiu made the Accusation in his official capacity as a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California. The Accusation, Statement to Respondent, and Notice of Defense were mailed, by certified and regular mail, to Respondent's last known mailing address on file with the Department on December 17, 2011.

On February 1, 2012, no Notice of Defense having been filed herein within the time prescribed by Section 11506 of the Government Code, Respondent's default was entered herein.

At all times mentioned herein, Respondent has been licensed by the Department as a real estate salesperson under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code (the Code).

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Respondent was convicted in the San Diego County Superior Court, in the case numbers and on the dates listed below, of three separate violations of California Penal Code Section 273.6(A) (disobeying court order to prevent domestic violence):

March 4, 2011,

Case # M121779DV

February 2, 2011,

crimes which are substantially related under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

The findings set out in paragraphs 1 through 3, above, constitute cause for the suspension or revocation of the licenses and license rights of Respondent under sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code.

The standard of proof applied was clear and convincing proof to a reasonable certainty.

<u>ORDER</u>

All licenses and licensing rights of Respondent TRAVIS JAMES AHERN under the provisions of Part I of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code are hereby revoked.
