The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, for cause of Accusation against SEAN PATRICK O'HARA, ("Respondent") alleges as follows:

1.

The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

2.

Respondent presently has a license and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the

California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a restricted real estate salesperson.

3.

(RESTRICTED LICENSE)

On or about April 25, 2005, a restricted real estate salesperson license was issued by the Department to Respondent on the terms, conditions and restrictions set forth in the Real Estate Commissioner's Decision of March 30, 2005, in Case No. H-3069 SD.

4.

Included in said terms, conditions and restrictions were the following:

"Respondent shall notify the Commissioner of Real Estate in writing of any arrest for any crime, whether misdemeanor or felony within seventy-two (72) hours of such an arrest."

5.

(CRIMINAL ARREST)

On February 1, 2012, Respondent was arrested by the Carlsbad Police Department on suspicion of violating California Penal Code Sections 470(d) (forgery), 664/487(b) (conversion of real estate), 530.5 (identity theft), 118(a) (perjury), 115(a) (offering false instrument to be filed) and 182(a)(4) (conspiracy), as well as Government Code Section 8225 (knowingly soliciting notary to perform improper act).

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Respondent did not notify the Commissioner of Real Estate of the arrest described in paragraph 5 above, within 72 hours.

7.

The conduct, acts, or omissions of Respondent, as described in paragraphs 5 and 6 above, constitute cause under Section 10177(k) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

8.

Code Section 10106, provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

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1 WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent SEAN PATRICK O'HARA, under the Real Estate Law, that Complainant be awarded its costs of investigation and prosecution of this case, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
