The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, for cause of Accusation against ARIAZ NAHAVANDCHI ("Respondent"), alleges as follows:

1.

The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

2.

Respondent presently has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate salesperson (License ID 02029837). Respondent's license expiration date was June 16, 2021; however, pursuant to Governor Newsom's Executive Order No. N-83-20, Respondent's license expiration date was extended until June 30, 2021.

ACCUSATION

(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

3.

On or about January 28, 2020, in the Superior Court of California, County of San Diego, Case No. CN399495, Respondent was convicted on a plea of guilty for violation of Penal Code section 647(a) (lewd conduct), a misdemeanor. The imposition of the sentence was suspended, and Respondent was placed on summary probation for three (3) years on certain terms and conditions, including, in part, completion of counseling, staying away from two named parties, and payment of fines.

4.

The conviction, as described in Paragraph 3 above, bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitutes cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

(COSTS OF INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT)

6.

California Business and Professions Code section 10106, provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable
