4	CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
5	(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

7	January 15, 2013; Penal Code ("PC") Section 211 - Felony
8	a. On or about October 24, 2012, in the Superior Court of California, San Diego
9	County, in Case No. SCE324784, The People of the State of California v. Rafael Francisco
10	Acosta, a felony complaint was filed against Respondent for violation of PC Section 211
11	(robbery), a felony.
12	b. On or about January 15, 2013, Respondent pled guilty to and was convicted of
13	violation of PC Section 211 (robbery), a felony.
14	c. Also on or about January 15, 2013, the Court suspended the imposition of
15	sentence and placed Respondent on formal probation for 3 years under certain terms and
