Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license on or about August 19, 2011.

On or about September 5, 2006, in the Superior Court, County of Placer, Respondent was convicted of a violation of Section 69 of the California Penal Code (Obstruct Resist Executive Officer), a felony, and Section 11550 of the California Health and Safety Code (Under Influence of a Controlled Substance), a misdemeanor, and crimes which bear a

substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about September 21, 2006, in the Superior Court, County of Placer,
Respondent was convicted of a violation of Section 4149(a) of the California Business and
Professions Code (Unauthorized Possession of Hypodermic Needle or Syringe), a misdemeanor
and crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of
Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about November 28, 2011, in the Superior Court, County of Sacramento, Respondent was convicted of a violation of Section 23152(b) of the California Vehicle Code (Driving with a Blood Alcohol Level of 0.08 or Higher), a misdemeanor and crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as alleged above, constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Sections 480(a) and 10177(b) of the California Business and Professions Code.

WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other provisions of law.
