23152(b) of the California Vehicle Code (driving under the influence of alcohol or a drug), a misdemeanor and a crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations (Regulations) to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about July 18, 2007 in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Yuba, Case No. CRM-0700105, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 236 of the California Penal Code (false imprisonment), a misdemeanor and a crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about March 23, 1992, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Nevada, Case No. M 92-313, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 484/490.5 of the California Penal Code (petty theft), a misdemeanor and a crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about February 24, 1992, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Nevada, Case No. 92-166, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 14601.1(a) of the California Vehicle Code (driving with a suspended license), a misdemeanor and a crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

Respondent's criminal convictions, as described above in Paragraphs 3 through 6, constitute cause for denial of his application for a real estate license under Sections 10177(b) (further grounds for disciplinary action-conviction of crime) and 480(a) (conviction of crime) of the Code.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, and for such other and further relief as may be proper in the premises.
