22	On or about April 24, 2015, Respondent made application to the Bureau of Real	
23	Estate of the State of California (Bureau) for a real estate salesperson license.

25	On or about October 10, 2010, in the Superior Court of the State of California,	
26	County of Placer, Case No. 62-099427, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 273.5(a)	
27	of the California Penal Code (corporal injury to spouse/cohabitant), a felony, Section 23152(a) or

the California Vehicle Code (driving under the influence of alcohol or a drug), a misdemeanor, and Section 14601.1 of the California Vehicle Code (driving with a suspended license), a misdemeanor, all crimes that bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10 of the California Code of Regulations, (Regulations), to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about November 8, 2002 in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Placer, Case No. 62-004670, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 242 of the California Penal Code (battery), Section 245(a) (1) of the California Penal Code (assault with a deadly weapon/great bodily injury likely) and Section 243(d) of the California Penal Code (batter w/serious bodily injury), all felonies and crimes that bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations, to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

PRIOR ADMINISTRATIVE DISCIPLINE

Effective January 6, 2012, in Case No. H-5657 SAC, the Real Estate Commissioner denied Respondent's application for a real estate license.

Respondent's criminal convictions, as set out in Paragraphs 3 and 4, above, constitute cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license pursuant to the provisions of Sections 480(a) (conviction of crime) and 10177(b) (further grounds for disciplinary action-conviction of crime) of the Code.
