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The Complainant, E. J. HABERER II, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, for Statement of Issues against BRIAN DANIEL SANCHEZ (hereinafter "Respondent"), is informed and alleges as follows:

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Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license on or about August 1, 2006, with the knowledge and understanding that any license issued as a result of said application would be subject to the conditions of Section 10153.4 of the Business and Professions Code.

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Complainant, E. J. HABERER II, a Deputy Real Estate

Commissioner of the State of California, makes this Statement of

Issues in his official capacity and not otherwise.

III

On or about December 16, 1999, in the Superior Court, County of Contra Costa, State of California, in case number 117652-8, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 23103 of the California Vehicle Code (Drive vehicle upon highway in willful and wanton disregard for safety), a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

IV

On or about March 3, 2006, in the Superior Court, County of Alameda, State of California, in case number 119324, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 23152(a) of the California Vehicle Code (Unlawfully driving a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol), a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

V

On or about October 30, 2007, in the Superior Court, County of Alameda, State of California, in case number 121280,

Respondent was convicted of violating Section 415 of the California Penal Code (Unlawfully fighting or challenging to fight in a public place, maliciously disturbs another by unreasonable noise, offensive words in a public place), a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

VI

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as allege in Paragraphs III, IV and V, above, individually and collectively, constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Sections 480(a) and 10177(b) of the California Business and Professions Code.

WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the aboveentitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the
charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to
authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real
estate salesperson license to Respondent, and for such other and
further relief as may be proper under other provisions of law.
