DECISION

This Decision is being issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 11520 of the Government Code, on evidence of compliance with Section 11505 of the Government Code and pursuant to the Order of Default filed on December 19, 2008, and the findings of fact set forth herein, which are based on one or more of the following: (l) Respondent's express admissions; (2) affidavits; and (3) other evidence.

This Decision revokes a real estate license on grounds of the conviction of a crime.

The right to reinstatement of a revoked real estate license is controlled by Section 11522 of the Government Code. A copy of Section 11522 and a copy of the Commissioner's <u>Criteria of Rehabilitation</u> are attached hereto for the information of Respondent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

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On July 1, 2008, Charles W. Koenig made the Accusation in his official capacity as a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California. The Accusation, Statement to Respondent, and Notice of Defense were mailed, by certified mail, to Respondent's last known mailing address on file with the Department on July 1, 2008.

On December 19, 2008, no Notice of Defense having been filed herein within the time prescribed by Section 11506 of the Government Code, Respondent's default was entered herein.

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At all times mentioned herein, Respondent has been licensed by the Department under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code (hereinafter "Code") as a restricted real estate salesperson.

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On or about June 27, 2008, in the Santa Clara County Superior Court (case number CC762731), Respondent was convicted of a violation of Section 23152(b) of the California Vehicle Code (driving with a blood alcohol level of 0.08% or higher) with two prior convictions, a misdemeanor which is substantially related under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations (hereinafter "Regulations") to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

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On or about September 25, 2005, in the Santa Clara County Superior Court, State of California (case number 320505), Respondent was convicted of a violation of California Vehicle Code Section 23152(b) (driving with a blood alcohol level of 0.08% or higher), a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

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Further, matters in aggravation include the following criminal conviction: a January 6, 2003 Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara conviction (case number CC271906) for violation of California Vehicle Code Section 23152(a) (driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs), a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

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The findings above constitute cause for the suspension or revocation of the licenses and license rights of Respondent under Sections 490 and/or 10177(b) of the Code.

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The standard of proof applied was clear and convincing proof to a reasonable certainty.

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<u>ORDER</u>

All licenses and licensing rights of Respondent, RYAN R. BERNARD, under the provisions of Part I of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code are hereby revoked.

BERNARD (hereinafter "Respondent") alleges as 17 follows: 18 19 20 The Complainant makes this Accusation in his official 21 capacity. 22 ΙI 23 Respondent is licensed and/or has license rights under 24 the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code (hereinafter "Code") as a real 25

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estate salesperson.

2 On or about June 27, 2007, in the Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara, Respondent was convicted of violation of California Vehicle Code Section 23152(b) with two 5 priors (Driving With a Blood Alcohol Level of 0.08% of Higher), 6 a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations (herein "the Regulations"), to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

MATTERS IN AGGRAVATION

On or about January 6, 2003, in the Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara, Respondent was convicted of violation of California Vehicle Code Section 23152(a) (Driving While Under the Influence of Alcohol or Drugs), a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about September 25, 2003, in the Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara, Respondent was convicted of violation of California Vehicle Code Section 23152(b) with a prior (Driving With a Blood Alcohol Level of 0.08% of Higher), a misdemeanor and a crime involving moral turpitude which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the Regulations 111

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to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

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The facts alleged above constitute cause under Section 10177(b) of the Code, in conjunction with Section 490 of the Code, for the suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code), and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other provisions of law.
