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DECISION

This Decision is being issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 11520 of the Government Code, on evidence of compliance with Section 11505 of the Government Code and pursuant to the Order of Default filed on December 12, 2012, and the findings of fact set forth herein, which are based on one or more of the following: (1) Respondent's express admissions; (2) affidavits; and (3) other evidence.

This Decision revokes a real estate license on grounds of the conviction of a crime.

The right to reinstatement of a revoked real estate license is controlled by Section 11522 of the Government Code. A copy of Section 11522 and a copy of the Commissioner's Criteria of Rehabilitation are attached hereto for the information of Respondent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1.

On June 8, 2011, E.J. Haberer, III, made the Accusation in his official capacity as a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California. The Accusation, Statement to Respondent, and Notice of Defense were mailed, by certified mail, return receipt requested, to Respondent's last known mailing address on file with the Department on June 14, 2011.

On December 12, 2012, no Notice of Defense having been received or filed herein within the time prescribed by Section 11506 of the Government Code, Respondent's default was entered herein.

2.

Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code (herein "the Code") as a real estate salesperson.

3.

On or about April 22, 2011, in United States District Court for the Northern District of California, in case number CR-10-00142-001 SI, Respondent was convicted of violating 11 U.S.C. Section 1349 (Conspiracy to Commit Mail Fraud) a felony which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations ("Regulations"), to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

#### DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

1.

Cause for disciplinary action against Respondent exists with reference to the conviction set out in Paragraph 3, above, pursuant to Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code.

2.

The standard of proof applied was clear and convincing proof to a reasonable certainty.


#### ORDER

The Department of Real Estate having met its burden of proof, it is hereby ordered that all licenses and licensing rights of Respondent LEONORA CAYETANO POMAR, under the provisions of Part I of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code, are revoked.

This Decision shall become effective at 12 o'clock noon on FEB 12 2013 .
