15	The Complainant, E. J. HABERER, II, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the	
16	State of California, for cause of Accusation against MICHAEL FEDELE CISTERNINO, (herei	
17	"Respondent"), is informed and alleges as follows:

19	Complainant makes this Accusation against Respondent in his official capacity.	
20	2	
21	Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate	
22	Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code (herein "the Code") as a real	
23	estate salesperson.

25	On or about January 18, 2011, in the Superior Court of the State of California,	
26	County of Los Angeles, Case No. LA 066355, Respondent was convicted of violating Section	
27	11366 of the California Health and Safety Code (Maintaining a Place for Sale of Illegal	

Marijuana), a misdemeanor and a crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

The facts alleged in Paragraph 3, above, constitute cause under Section 10177(b) (Further Grounds for Disciplinary Action-Conviction of Crime) and Section 490 (Conviction Substantially Related Crime) of the Code for suspension or revocation of Respondent's license under the Real Estate Law.

COST RECOVERY

Section 10106 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the department, the commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered revoking all licenses and license rights of Respondent(s) under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code), for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other provisions of law.
