15	The Complainant, ROBIN S. TANNER, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner
16	of the State of California, for Statement of Issues against AMBER MARIE MERRIGAN
17	(hereinafter "Respondent"), is informed and alleges as follows:

19	The Complainant makes this Statement of Issues in her official capacity.

21	On or about October 29, 2012, Respondent made application to the Department
22	of Real Estate of the State of California (hereinafter "Department") for a real estate salesperson
23	license.

2	On or about November 2, 2006, in the Superior Court of the State of California,
2	County of Alameda, Case No. 394287, Respondent was convicted of a violation of Section
2	7 484(a) of the California Penal Code (petty theft), a misdemeanor and a crime which bears a

substantial relationship under Section 2910 of the California Code of Regulations (hereinafter "Regulations"), to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

On or about September 12, 2011, Respondent made application to the Department for a real estate salesperson license. On or about February 2, 2012, the Department issued its Statement of Issues, recommending the denial of Respondent's application. Following an Administrative Hearing before Administrative Law Judge Kirk E. Miller on March 29, 2012, a Proposed Decision issued, recommending the granting of a restricted real estate salesperson license to Respondent. On September 28, 2012, Real Estate Commissioner Wayne S. Bell issued an Order that Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license be denied.

Respondent's criminal conviction, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license under Section 10177(b) (license denial for conviction of crime) and Section 480(a)(1) (conviction of crime) of the California Business and Professions Code.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under any other provision of the law.
