TANNER, acting in her official capacity as a 15 Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, for Statement of Issues against 16 MARCUS DOYLE SCHAIBLE ("Respondent"), alleges as follows: 17 1. 18 On or about December 28, 2012, Respondent made application to the Bureau of 19 Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license. 20 FAILURE TO DISCLOSE CONVICTIONS 21 2. 22 In response to Part D, Question 1 of said application, to wit: "HAVE YOU 23 EVER BEEN CONVICTED OF A MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY? CONVICTIONS 24 EXPUNGED UNDER PENAL CODE SECTION 1203.4 MUST BE DISCLOSED. 25 HOWEVER, YOU MAY OMIT TRAFFIC CITATIONS WHICH DO NOT 26

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CONSTITUTE A MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY", Respondent concealed and failed to disclose the convictions described below in Paragraphs 4, 7 and 8.

CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS

3.

On or about January 12, 2009, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Humboldt, Case Number CR084123, Respondent was convicted of violating section 242 of the Penal Code (battery), a misdemeanor which bears a substantial relationship under section 2910, title 10, California Code of Regulations (herein "the Regulations") to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

4.

On or about January 12, 2009, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Humboldt, Case Number CR085293S, Respondent was convicted of violating section 14601.5(a) of the Vehicle Code (driving with a suspended or revoked license), a misdemeanor which bears a substantial relationship under section 2910, title 10 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

On or about June 19, 2007, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Humboldt, Case Number CR072839S, Respondent was convicted of violating section 23152(a) of the Vehicle Code (driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs), a misdemeanor which bears a substantial relationship under section 2910, title 10 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

6.

On or about July 31, 2000, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Humboldt, Case Number CR003201S, Respondent was convicted of violating section 23152(b) of the Vehicle Code (driving with a blood alcohol level at or above .08%), a misdemeanor which bears a substantial relationship under section 2910, title 10 of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

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On or about May 22, 2000, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Alameda, Case Number 336906, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code sections 242 (battery) and 415 (disturbing the peace), misdemeanors which bears a substantial relationship under section 2910, title 10, of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

8.

On or about April 24, 1991, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Alameda, Case Number 262542, Respondent was convicted of violating section 12500(a) of the Vehicle Code (driving without a license) a misdemeanor which bears a substantial relationship under section 2910, title 10, of the Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINE

9.

In failing to reveal the convictions described above in Paragraphs 4, 7 and 8, Respondent procured or attempted to procure a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit, or by making a material misstatement of fact in said application, which constitutes grounds for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under sections 480(c) and 10177(a) of the Business and Professions Code ("the Code").

10.

Respondent's criminal convictions, as described above in Paragraphs 3 through 8, constitute grounds for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under sections 480(a) and 10177(b) of the Code.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to

authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, and for such other and further relief as may be proper in the premises. ROBIN S.
