## ORDER GRANTING REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSE

On June 6, 2018, in Case No. H-12189 SF a Decision was rendered revoking the real estate broker license of Respondent effective July 3, 2018, but granting Respondent the right to the issuance of a restricted real estate broker license. A restricted real estate broker license was issued to Respondent on August 10, 2018, and Respondent has held a restricted license since that time.

On February 11, 2021, Respondent petitioned for reinstatement of Respondent's real estate broker license, and the Attorney General of the State of California has been given notice of the filing of the petition.

I have considered Respondent's petition and the evidence submitted in support thereof. Respondent has demonstrated to my satisfaction that Respondent meets the requirements of law for the issuance to Respondent of an unrestricted real estate broker license and that it would not be against the public interest to issue said license to Respondent.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent's petition for reinstatement is granted and that a real estate broker license be issued to Respondent if Respondent satisfies the following requirements:

- 1. Submits a completed application and pays the fee for a real estate broker license within the 12 month period following the date of this Order; and
- 2. Submits proof that Respondent has completed the continuing education requirements for renewal of the license sought. The continuing education courses must be completed either (i) within the 12 month period preceding the filing of the completed application, or (ii) within the 12 month period following the date of this Order.

This Order shall become effective immediately.
