19	On or about October 27, 2017, Respondent made application to the Department of
20	Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license.

22	In response to Question 23 of said application to wit: "HAVE YOU EVER BEEN
23	CONVICTED (SEE PARAGRAPH ABOVE) OF ANY VIOLATION OF THE LAW AT THE
24	MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY LEVEL? IF YES, COMPLETE ITEM 29 WITH
25	INFORMATION ON EACH CONVICTION," Respondent concealed and failed to disclose
26	the conviction described below in Paragraph 3.
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On or about March 16, 2012, in the United States District Court, Northern District of California, Case No. 2010-10299, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 20002(a) (hit and run) of the California Vehicle Code, a misdemeanor and a crime that bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee pursuant to Section 2910, Title 10, of the California Code of Regulations.

## **GROUNDS FOR DENIAL**

Respondent's failure to disclose the conviction described above in Paragraph 3 constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license pursuant to the provisions of Sections 480(d) (false statement of fact required to be revealed in application) and 10177(a) (attempted procurement of real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit) of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code").

Respondent's criminal conviction described above in Paragraphs 3 constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license pursuant to the provisions of Sections 480(a)(1) (conviction of crime), 480(a)(2) (act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit), 10177(b) (conviction of crime), and 10177(j) (engaged in conduct that constitutes fraud or dishonest dealing) of the Code.

WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson/broker license to
