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19	Complainant makes this Accusation against Respondent in her official capacity.

21	At all times herein mentioned, Respondent was and is presently licensed and/or			
22	has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and			
23	Professions Code (the Code), by the Department of Real Estate (the Department) as a real estate			
24	salesperson.	2

26	On or about August 21, 2020, in the Superior Court of the State of California,			
27	County of San Mateo, Case No. 19NM0115035A, Respondent was convicted of violating			

Section 23153(b) of the California Vehicle Code (driving under the influence of alcohol or a drug/causing bodily harm) with an enhancement per Section 23558 of the California Vehicle Code (one plus victim while dui), a misdemeanor and crime which bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.

MATTERS IN AGGRAVATION

On or about April 3, 2006, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of San Mateo, Case No. NM352820, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 242 of the California Penal Code (battery), a misdemeanor. On or about May 6, 2010, this matter was expunged pursuant to Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code.

On or about July 28, 2005, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of San Mateo, Case No. SM340642A, Respondent was convicted of violating Section 415(1) of the California Penal Code (fight/challenge to a fight), a misdemeanor. On or about September 6, 2012, this matter was expunged pursuant to Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code.

The facts alleged in Paragraph 3, above, constitute cause under Section 10177(b) (further grounds for disciplinary action-conviction of crime) and Section 490 (conviction of substantially related crime) of the Code for suspension or revocation of Respondent's license under the Real Estate Law.

A diligent search was made of the records of the Department of Real Estate (Department), relating to Respondent's Real Estate Salesperson License. As a result of said search, no record was discovered having been received from Respondent notifying the Department, in writing, of any conviction.

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The facts alleged above, in Paragraphs 3 and 7, constitute a violation of Section 10186.2 (failure to report in writing, a conviction within 30 days) of the Code, and are grounds for revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under Section 10177(d) of the Code.

Section 10106 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department, the commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that, upon proof thereof, a Decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Code, for the reasonable costs of investigation and prosecution of this case, including agency attorney's fees, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under provisions of law.
