ORDER GRANTING UNRESTRICTED LICENSE

On December 5, 2002, a Decision was rendered herein, denying Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license, but granting Respondent the right to the issuance of a restricted real estate salesperson license. A restricted real estate salesperson license was issued to Respondent on January 2, 2003.

On September 5, 2008, Respondent petitioned for removal of restrictions attaching to Respondent's real estate salesperson license.

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I have considered Respondent's petition and the 2 evidence submitted in support thereof. Respondent has . 3 7

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demonstrated to my satisfaction that Respondent meets the requirements of law for the issuance to Respondent of an unrestricted real estate salesperson license and that it would not be against the public interest to issue said license to Respondent. NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent's

petition for removal of restrictions is granted and that an unrestricted real estate salesperson license be issued to Respondent if Respondent satisfies the following conditions within nine (9) months from the date of this Order:

- Submittal of a completed application and payment of the fee for a real estate salesperson license.
- Submittal of evidence of having since the most recent issuance of an original or renewal real estate license, taken and successfully completed the continuing education requirements of Article 2.5 of Chapter 3 of the Real Estate Law for renewal of a real estate license.

This Order shall be effective immediately.



STIPULATION AND
WAIVER

Respondent

I, GILBERT MARQUEZ, respondent herein, do hereby affirm that I have applied to the Department of Real Estate for a real estate salesperson license and that to the best of my knowledge I have satisfied all of the statutory requirements for the issuance of the license, including the payment of the fee therefor.

I acknowledge that I have received and read the Statement of Issues and the Statement to Respondent filed by the Department of Real Estate on November 6, 2002, in connection with my application for a real estate salesperson license. I understand that the Real Estate Commissioner may hold a hearing on this Statement of Issues for the purpose of requiring further proof of my honesty and truthfulness and to prove other allegations therein, or that she may in her discretion waive the hearing and grant me a restricted real estate salesperson license based upon this Stipulation and Waiver. I also understand that by filing the Statement of Issues in this matter the Real Estate Commissioner is shifting the burden to me to make a satisfactory showing that I meet all the requirements for issuance of a real estate salesperson license. I further understand that by entering into this stipulation and waiver I will be stipulating that the Real Estate Commissioner has found that I have failed to make such a showing, thereby justifying the denial of the issuance to me of an unrestricted real estate salesperson license.

I understand that any such restricted license will be issued subject to and be limited by Section 10153.4 of the Business and Professions Code.

I am aware that by signing this Stipulation and Waiver, I am waiving my right to a hearing and the

I hereby admit that the allegations of the Statement of Issues filed against me are true and correct and

I am aware that by signing this Stipulation and Waiver, I am waiving my right to a hearing and the opportunity to present evidence at the hearing to establish my rehabilitation in order to obtain an unrestricted real estate salesperson license if this Stipulation and Waiver is accepted by the Real Estate Commissioner. However, I am not waiving my right to a hearing and to further proceedings to obtain a restricted or unrestricted license if this Stipulation and Waiver is not accepted by the Commissioner.

I further understand that the following conditions, limitations, and restrictions will attach to a restricted license issued by the Department of Real Estate pursuant hereto:

- 1. The license shall not confer any property right in the privileges to be exercised including the right of renewal, and the Real Estate Commissioner may by appropriate order suspend the right to exercise any privileges granted under this restricted license in the event of:
 - a. The conviction of respondent (including a plea of nolo contendere) to a crime which bears a substantial relationship to respondent's fitness or capacity as a real estate licensee; or
 - b. The receipt of evidence that respondent has violated provisions of the California Real

 Estate Law, the Subdivided Lands Law, Regulations of the Real Estate Commissioner, or
 conditions attaching to this restricted license.
- 2. I shall not be eligible to apply for the issuance of an unrestricted real estate license nor the removal of any of the conditions, limitations or restrictions attaching to the restricted license until two years have elapsed from the date of issuance of the restricted license to respondent.
- 3. With the application for license, or with the application for transfer to a new employing broker, I shall submit a statement signed by the prospective employing broker on a form approved by the Department of Real Estate wherein the employing broker shall certify as follows:

a. That broker has read the Statement of Issues which is the basis for the issuance of the restricted license; and

- b. That broker will carefully review all transaction documents prepared by the restricted licensee and otherwise exercise close supervision over the licensee's performance of acts for which a license is required.
- My restricted real estate salesperson license is issued subject to the requirements of Section 10153.4 of the Business and Professions Code, to wit: I am required, within eighteen (18) months of the issuance of the restricted license, to submit evidence satisfactory to the Commissioner of successful completion, at an accredited institution, of two of the courses listed in Section 10153.2, other than real estate principles, advanced legal aspects of real estate, advanced real estate finance, or advanced real estate appraisal. If I fail to timely present to the Department satisfactory evidence of successful completion of the two required courses, the restricted license shall be automatically suspended effective eighteen (18) months after the date of its issuance. Said suspension shall not be lifted unless, prior to the expiration of the restricted license, I have submitted the required evidence of course completion and the Commissioner has given written notice to me of the lifting of the suspension.
- 5. Pursuant to Section 10154, if I have not satisfied the requirements for an unqualified license under Section 10153.4, I shall not be entitled to renew the restricted license, and shall not be entitled to the issuance of another license which is subject to Section 10153.4 until four years after the date of the issuance of the preceding restricted license.

Therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a restricted real estate salesperson license be issued to respondent GILBERT MARQUEZ if respondent has otherwise fulfilled all of the statutory requirements for licensure. The restricted license shall be limited, conditioned, and restricted as specified in the foregoing Stipulation and Waiver.

This Order is effective immediately.

STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Respondent.

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The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Deputy Real Estate
Commissioner of the State of California, for Statement of Issues
against GILBERT MARQUEZ (Respondent) is informed and alleges in
her official capacity as follows:

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Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license on or about June 14, 2002, with the knowledge and understanding that any license issued as a result of said application would be subject to Section 10153.4(c) under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code) (Code).

2.

On July 13, 1993, in the Municipal Court of Pomona

Judicial District, County of Los Angeles, State of California,
respondent was convicted by a guilty plea to violating one count
of Section 242 (battery), a misdemeanor crime, which by its facts
and circumstances, involves moral turpitude and is substantially
related under Section 2910, Chapter 6, Title 10 of the California
Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions or duties
of a real estate licensee.

3.

This crime constitutes cause for denial of respondent's application for a real estate license under Sections 480(a) and 10177(b) of the Code.

These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code and Sections 11500 through 11529 of the California Government Code.

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WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent GILBERT MARQUEZ, and for such other and further relief as may be proper in the premises.
