Respondent's conviction for receiving stolen property, as set forth in Paragraph 3, constitutes grounds for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license pursuant to Business and Professions Code Sections 480(a) and 10177(b). These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of the Government Code. // 3 -
