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

STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Respondent.

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The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Deputy Real Estate
Commissioner of the State of California, for Statement of Issues
against JOE L. DU aka Thinh Lien Du aka Joetinh Du aka Joetinh
Lien Du, (respondent) is informed and alleges in her official
capacity as follows:

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Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license on or about November 26, 2001.

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In response to Question 25 of said license application,

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to wit: "Have you ever been convicted of any violation of law?

Convictions expunged under Penal code Section 1203.4 must be disclosed. However, you may omit minor traffic citations which do not constitute a misdemeanor or felony offense." Respondent checked the box denoting "No". Respondent failed to disclose the conviction set forth below. In addition, in response to Question 18 of said license application to wit, "Have you used any other names (i.e. Maiden Name, AKA's Etc.,?") Respondent checked the box denoting "No" and failed to disclose the names set forth above.

On October 28, 1994, in the Superior/Municipal Court of California, County of Yolo, respondent was convicted on a plea of nolo contendere to violating one count of Penal Code Section 459 (burglary), a felony crime. This crime by its facts and circumstances involves moral turpitude and is substantially related under Section 2910(a) of Title 10, Chapter 6, of the California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee. On February 9, 1998, this felony was reduced to a misdemeanor and dismissed pursuant to Penal Code Sections 17(b) and 1203.4.

Respondent's failure to reveal the conviction and the "AKA's" in his application that are set forth in the preamble above, constitutes an attempt to procure a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation or deceit or by making a material

misstatement of fact on his application, which is cause for denial of respondent's application for a real estate salesperson's license under Code Sections 475(a), 480(c) and 10177(a).

5.

The crime set forth above constitutes cause for denial of respondent's application for a real estate license under Sections 480(a) and 10177(b) of the Code.

These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of the Government Code of the State of California.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, that upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent JOE L. DU and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law. Dated at Los Angeles, California this 2ff day of Juliusus 2003.
