

On July 14, 2004, the above-named Respondent filed with the Department of Real Estate of the State of California ("Department") an application for a real estate salesperson license. In response to Question 25 in said application, to wit: "Have you ever been convicted of any violation of Law? (Conviction expunged under Penal Code Section 1203.4 must be disclosed). However, you may omit minor traffic citations which do not constitute a misdemeanor or felony offense", Respondent answered "Yes", but failed to

reveal two convictions for violating of California Penal Code Section 484(A) (Theft of Property).

On October 29, 2004, the Department issued a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, subject to the conditions of Section 10153.4 of the Business and Professions Code, in reliance upon the aforesaid answer of the Respondent.

On January 12, 2005, in Case No. H-31617LA, a

Statement of Issues signed by Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California was filed charging Respondent with having procured a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation or deceit and with knowingly having made a false statement of fact required to be revealed in the application for such license.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED under authority of Section 10177.1 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California that the real estate salesperson license heretofore issued to respondent and the exercise of any privileges thereunder is hereby suspended pending final determination made after a hearing on the aforesaid Statement of Issues, a copy of which is attached hereto.

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

STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Respondent.

The Complainant

The Complainant, Janice Waddell, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, for cause of Statement of Issues against SUZANNE MATEK ("Respondent"), is informed and alleges as follows:

1.

The Complainant, Janice Waddell, a Deputy Real Estate
Commissioner of the State of California, makes this Statement
of Issues against Respondent in her official capacity.

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Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license on or about July 14, 2004, with the knowledge and understanding that any license issued as a result of said application would be subject to the conditions of Business and Professions Code ("Code") Section 10153.4.

3.

(CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS)

On or around January 3, 1994, in the Municipal Court of Torrance Judicial District, County of Los Angeles, State of California, in Case No. 93M09914, Respondent, SUZANNE MATEK, was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 484(A) (Theft of Property). The underlying facts of this crime involve moral turpitude, which bears a substantial relationship under Title 10, Chapter 6, Section 2910, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

4.

On or around September 17, 1996, in the Municipal Court of Torrance Judicial District, County of Los Angeles, State of California, in Case No. 6SB07223, Respondent, SUZANNE MATEK, was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 484(A) (Theft of Property). The underlying facts of this crime involve moral turpitude, which bears a substantial relationship under Title 10, Chapter 6, Section 2910, California Code of

Regulations, to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as alleged herein above in Paragraphs 3 and 4, constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Code Sections 475(a)(2), 480(a)(1) and/or 10177(b).

6.

(FAILURE TO REVEAL CONVICTION)

In response to Question 25 of her license application, to wit: "HAVE YOU EVER BEEN CONVICTED OF ANY VIOLATION OF LAW? CONVICTION EXPUNGED UNDER PENAL CODE SECTION 1203.4 MUST BE DISCLOSED. HOWEVER, YOU MAY OMIT MINOR TRAFFIC CITATIONS WHICH DO NOT CONSTITUTE A MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY OFFENSE". Respondent answered "Yes", but failed to reveal both convictions described herein above.

Respondent's failure to reveal both convictions set forth herein above, in her license application, constitutes, knowingly making a false statement of material fact required to be revealed in said application, which is grounds for denial of the issuance of a license under Business and Professions Code Sections 475(a)(1); 480(c) and 10177(a).

The Statement of Issues is brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 and 11529 of the Government Code.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that the above entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, SUZANNE MATEK, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other provisions of law.
