ORDER GRANTING UNRESTRICTED LICENSE

On February 14, 2007, a Decision was rendered herein denying the real estate salesperson license of Respondent, but granting Respondent the right to the issuance of a restricted real estate salesperson license. A restricted real estate salesperson license was issued to Respondent on March 17, 2007 and Respondent has operated as a restricted licensee without cause for disciplinary action against Respondent since that time,

On or about November 17, 2009, Respondent petitioned for removal of restrictions of said real estate salesperson license.

I have considered Respondent's petition and the evidence and arguments submitted in support thereof. Respondent has demonstrated to my satisfaction that Respondent meets the requirements of law for the issuance to Respondent of an unrestricted real estate

It is hereby stipulated by and between GEORGE MUNOZ (hereinafter "Respondent") and Respondent's attorney, Joanne Mirras Knauss, and the Complainant, acting by and through Alvaro Mejia, Counsel for the Department of Real Estate, as follows for the purpose of settling and disposing of the Statement of Issues filed on November 2, 2006 in this matter:

Respondent acknowledges that Respondent has received and read the Statement of Issues and the Statement to Respondent filed by the Department of Real Estate in connection with Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license. Respondent understands that the Real Estate Commissioner may hold a hearing on this Statement of Issues for the purpose of requiring further proof of Respondent's honesty and truthfulness and to prove other allegations therein, or that he may in his discretion waive the hearing and grant Respondent a restricted real estate salesperson license based upon this Stipulation and Waiver. Respondent also understands that by filing the Statement of Issues in this matter the Real Estate Commissioner is shifting the burden to Respondent to make a satisfactory showing that Respondent meets all the requirements for issuance of a real estate salesperson license. Respondent further understands that by

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entering into this stipulation and waiver Respondent will be stipulating that the Real Estate Commissioner has found that Respondent has failed to make such a showing, thereby justifying the denial of the issuance to Respondent of an unrestricted real estate salesperson license.

Respondent hereby admits that the allegations of the Statement of Issues filed against Respondent are true and correct and requests that the Real Estate Commissioner in his discretion issue a restricted real estate salesperson license to Respondent under the authority of Section 10156.5 of the Business and Professions Code. Respondent understands that any such restricted license will be issued subject to and be limited by Section 10153.4 of the Business and Professions Code.

Respondent is aware that by signing this Stipulation and Waiver, Respondent is waiving Respondent's right to a hearing and the opportunity to present evidence at the hearing to establish Respondent's rehabilitation in order to obtain an unrestricted real estate salesperson license if this Stipulation and Waiver is accepted by the Real Estate Commissioner. However, Respondent is not waiving Respondent's right to a hearing and to further proceedings to obtain a restricted or unrestricted license if this Stipulation and Waiver is not accepted by the Commissioner.

Respondent further understands that the following conditions, limitations, and restrictions will attach to a restricted license issued by the Department of Real Estate pursuant hereto:

- 1. The license shall not confer any property right in the privileges to be exercised including the right of renewal, and the Real Estate Commissioner may by appropriate order suspend the right to exercise any privileges granted under this restricted license in the event of:
 - a. The conviction of Respondent (including a plea of nolo contendere) to a crime which bears a substantial relationship to Respondent's fitness or capacity as a real estate licensee; or
 - b. The receipt of evidence that Respondent has violated provisions of the California Real Estate Law, the Subdivided Lands Law, Regulations of the Real Estate Commissioner, or conditions attaching to this restricted license.
- 2. Respondent shall not be eligible to apply for the issuance of an unrestricted real estate license nor the removal of any of the conditions, limitations or restrictions attaching to the restricted

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license until two years have elapsed from the date of issuance of the restricted license to Respondent.

- 3. With the application for license, or with the application for transfer to a new employing broker, Respondent shall submit a statement signed by the prospective employing broker on a form approved by the Department of Real Estate wherein the employing broker shall certify as follows:
 - a. That broker has read the Statement of Issues which is the basis for the issuance of the restricted license; and
 - b. That broker will carefully review all transaction documents prepared by the restricted licensee and otherwise exercise close supervision over the licensee's performance of acts for which a license is required.
 - Respondent's restricted real estate salesperson license is issued subject to the requirements of Section 10153.4 of the Business and Professions Code, to wit: Respondent is required, within eighteen (18) months of the issuance of the restricted license, to submit evidence satisfactory to successful completion, at án accredited institution, of Commissioner of a course in real estate practices and one of the courses listed in Section 10153.2, other than real estate principles, advanced legal aspects of real estate, advanced real estate finance, or advanced real estate appraisal. If Respondent fails to timely present to the Department satisfactory evidence of successful completion of the two required courses, the restricted license shall be automatically suspended effective eighteen (18) months after the date of its issuance. Said suspension shall not be lifted unless, prior to the expiration of the restricted license, Respondent has submitted the required evidence of course completion and the Commissioner has given written notice to Respondent of the lifting of the suspension.
- 5. Pursuant to Section 10154, if Respondent has not satisfied the requirements for an unqualified license under Section 10153.4, Respondent shall not be entitled to renew the restricted license, and shall not be entitled to the issuance of another license which is subject to Section 10153.4 until four years after the date of the issuance of the preceding restricted license.

6	understood by me and are agreeable and acceptable to me. I understand that I am waiving rights given to me
	by the California Administrative Procedure Act (including but not limited to Sections 11506, 11508, 11509,

8	and 11513 of the Government Code), and I willingly, intelligently, and voluntarily waive those rights,
9	including the right of a hearing on the Statement of Issues at which I would have the right to cross-examine
0	witnesses against me and to present evidence in defense and mitigation of the charges.

3	number (213) 576-6917. Respondent agrees, acknowledges and understands that by electronically sending
4	to the Department a fax copy of his actual signature as it appears on the Stipulation and Waiver, that receipt
5	of the faxed copy by the Department shall be as binding on Respondent as if the Department had received
6	the original signed Stipulation and Waiver.

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I have read the Statement of Issues filed herein and the foregoing Stipulation and Waiver signed by Respondent. I am satisfied that the hearing for the purpose of requiring further proof as to the honesty and truthfulness of Respondent need not be called and that it will not be inimical to the public interest to issue a restricted real estate salesperson license to Respondent.

Therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a restricted real estate salesperson license be issued to
Respondent, if Respondent has otherwise fulfilled all of the statutory requirements for licensure. The
restricted license shall be limited, conditioned, and restricted as specified in the foregoing Stipulation and
Waiver.

This Order is effective immediately.

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Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license on or about November 8, 2005, with the knowledge and understanding that any license issued as a result of said application would be subject to the conditions of Business and Professions Code ("Code") Section 10153.4.

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(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

On or about January 30, 1997, in the Municipal Court of Santa Clarita Courthouse Judicial District, County of Los Angeles, State of California, in case no. PA025613, Respondent was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 487(a) (Grand Theft: Property over \$400), a felony. The underlying facts of this crime involve moral turpitude and are substantially related under Title 10, Chapter 6, Section 2910, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

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The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as alleged herein above in Paragraph 3, constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Business and Professions Code Sections 475(a)(2); 480(a)(1); and/or 10177(b).

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(PRIOR DEPARTMENT ACTION)

On or about August 16, 2002, the State of California,
Department of Real Estate, in case no. H-29643 LA, sought the
denial of Respondent's real estate salesperson license. As more
fully set forth in the Decision for the above-mentioned case,
cited below, The Department of Real Estate established that
grounds existed for the denial of Respondent's real estate
license based on his criminal conviction and his failure to
disclose his conviction on this application.

On November 5, 2002, this matter was heard before the Office of Administrative Hearings, Los Angeles, California. The Proposed Decision of December 2, 2002, denying Respondent's real estate salesperson license, was adopted by the California Real Estate Commissioner on January 2, 2003. The Order became effective January 22, 2003.

The Statement of Issues is brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 and 11529 of the Government Code.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that the above entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, GEORGE MUNOZ, and for such other and further relief as may be proper in the premises.
