DECISION

This Decision is being issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 11520 of the Government Code, on evidence of compliance with Section 11505 of the Government Code and pursuant to the Order of Default filed on January 30, 2008, and the findings of fact set forth herein are based on one or more of the following: (1) Respondent's express admissions; (2) affidavits; and (3) other evidence.

This Decision revokes a real estate license on grounds of the conviction of a crime.

The right to reinstatement of a revoked real estate license or to the reduction of a suspension is controlled by Section 11522 of the Government Code. A copy of Section 11522 and a copy of the Commissioner's <u>Criteria of Rehabilitation</u> are attached hereto for the information of Respondent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Ι

On October 18, 2007 Maria Suarez made the Accusation in her official capacity as a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California. The Accusation, Statement to Respondent, and Notice of Defense were mailed, by certified mail, to Respondent's last known mailing address on file with the Department on October 23, 2007.

On January 29, 2008, no Notice of Defense having been filed herein within the time prescribed by Section 11506 of the Government Code, Respondent's default was entered herein.

II

Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code (hereinafter "Code") as a real estate broker. Effective October 29, 2006, Respondent's real estate broker license expired. Pursuant to Code Section 10201, Respondent has a two-year right of renewal. Pursuant to Code Section 10103, the Department of Real Estate retains jurisdiction.

III

On or about April 18, 2006, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in case no. VA081200, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code 245(A) (Assault With Firearm), Penal Code 273.5 (Inflicting Corporal Injury on Spouse) and Penal Code 236 (False Imprisonment), all three of which are felonies.

VI

The evidence established that the crimes of which Respondent was convicted involve moral turpitude and is substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of a real estate licensee.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

Ι

Cause for disciplinary action against Respondent exists pursuant to Business and Professions Code Sections 490 and 10177(b).

ΙI

The standard of proof applied was clear and convincing proof to a reasonable certainty.

ORDER

The licenses and license rights of Respondent DERICK WHITFIELD PAYNE under the provisions of Part I of Division					
4 of the Business and Professions Code, are revoked.

Respondent.

The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, for cause of Accusation against DERICK WHITFIELD PAYNE, ("Respondent") alleges as follows:

The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

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2.

Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate broker. Effective October 29, 2006, Respondent's real estate broker license expired. Pursuant to Code Section 10201, Respondent has a two-year right of renewal. Pursuant to Code Section 10103, the Department of Real Estate retains jurisdiction.

3.

(CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS)

On or about April 18, 2006, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in case no. VA081200, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code 245(A) (Assault With Firearm), Penal Code 273.5 (Inflicting Corporal Injury on Spouse) and Penal Code 236 (False Imprisonment), all three of which are felonies. These crimes involve moral turpitude, which bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

4.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitute cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of

the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent, DERICK WHITFIELD PAYNE, under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code) and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
