against RAFAEL L. VALENZUELA, a.k.a. Ralph Valenzuela, Rafael V.

Lopez, Rafael Valenzuela-Lopez and Rafael Lopez Valenzuela

("Respondent"), is informed and alleges in his official capacity

as follows:

1.

On or about September 28, 2009, Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL

(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

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On or about June 24, 1993, Respondent was convicted in the State of California, Case No. MWV35268, for violating California Penal Code Section 148.9 (false representation to peace officer), a misdemeanor. Said crime bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

3.

In aggravation, on or about May 17, 1993, Respondent was convicted in the State of California, Case No. 93M05018, for violating California Penal Code Section 12031(a)(carrying a loaded firearm), a misdemeanor.

4.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as alleged in Paragraph 2 above, constitutes cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Business and Professions Code Sections 475(a)(2), 480(a) and 10177(b).

5.

(PENDING CRIMINAL CHARGES)

On or about January 29, 1999, Respondent was arrested in Riverside County, California for a violation of Penal Code Section 476a (nonsufficient funds checks). On or about April

13, 2000, a criminal complaint was filed in the Superior Court of California, County of Riverside, Case No. RIM394668, alleging a violation of Penal Code Section 476a (nonsufficient funds checks), a misdemeanor. On May 5, 2000 an arrest warrant was issued when Respondent failed to appear at his arraignment. The warrant remains active to date.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL

(FAILURE TO REVEAL CONVICTION)

6.

In response to Question 23 of the license application, to wit: "HAVE YOU EVER BEEN CONVICTED OF A MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY? CONVICTIONS EXPUNGED UNDER PENAL CODE SECTION 1203.4 MUST BE DISCLOSED. HOWEVER, YOU MAY OMIT TRAFFIC CITATIONS WHICH DO NOT CONSTITUTE A MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY", Respondent failed to reveal the convictions described in Paragraphs 2 and 3 above.

7.

Respondent's failure to disclose the conviction, as set forth in Paragraph 2 above, in his license application, constitutes an attempt to procure a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit, or by making a false statement of material fact required to be revealed in said application, which is grounds for denial of the issuance of a license under Business and Professions Code Sections 475(a)(1), 480(c) and 10177(a).

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THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL

(FAILURE TO REVEAL PENDING CRIMINAL CHARGES)

8.

In response to Question 24 of the license application, to wit: "ARE THERE CRIMINAL CHARGES PENDING AGAINST YOU AT THIS TIME", Respondent failed to reveal the charges described in Paragraph 5 above.

9.

Respondent's failure to disclose the charges, as set forth in Paragraph 5 above, in his license application, constitutes an attempt to procure a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit, or by making a false statement of material fact required to be revealed in said application, which is grounds for denial of the issuance of a license under Business and Professions Code Sections 475(a)(1), 480(c) and 10177(a).

These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of the California Government Code.

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WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the aboveentitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, RAFAEL L. VALENZUELA, and for such other and further relief as may be proper in the premises.
