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PRESENT LICENSE APPLICATION OF 2010

2.

On or about June 24, 2010, Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California

("Department") for a real estate salesperson license.

CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS

3.

On or about October 22, 2004, in the Superior Court of the State of California, Tulare County, in Case No. VCF107826, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Section 11550(a) (under influence of a controlled substance - cocaine) and Vehicle Code Sections 23152(a) (driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs) and 23152(b) (driving under the influence with blood alcohol content 0.08% or greater), all misdemeanors. Respondent was sentenced to five years probation and 90 days in county jail; ordered to pay fines; and ordered to register as a narcotic offender pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 11590.

On or about August 11, 1999, in the Superior Court of the State of California, San Luis Obispo County, in Case No. M000285721, Respondent was convicted of violating Vehicle Code Section 23152(a) (driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs), a misdemeanor. Respondent was sentenced to three years probation and 48 hours in jail; ordered to pay fines; and ordered to complete the driving while intoxicated first offender program.

5.

These crimes, by their facts and circumstances, bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter

6, California Code of Regulations, to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

6.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted constitute cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under Business and Professions Code Sections 475(a)(2), 480(a), and 10177(b).

PRIOR APPLICATION OF 2004

7.

On or about August 12, 2004, Respondent, pursuant to the provisions of Code Section 10153.3, made a previous application ("Prior Application") to the Department of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license, with the knowledge and understanding that any license issued as a result of said application would be subject to the conditions of Code Section 10153.4.

A Statement of Issues was filed on September 16, 2005 in Department Case No. H-1829 FR, on the Prior Application. This matter went to hearing before the Office of Administrative Hearings on November 22, 2005. Respondent appeared on his own behalf. Proposed Decision was rendered on December 20, 2005, ordering the denial of Respondent's license application. The Decision adopting the Proposed Decision became effective on February 9, 2006.

These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code

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of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of
    the California Government Code.
