STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Respondent.

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The Complainant, Robin Trujillo, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, acting in her official capacity, for Statement of Issues against JAHMALL B. ELLIS aka Jahmall Batiste Ellis aka Jahmall Batist Ellis ("Respondent") alleges as follows:

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On or about April 18, 2011, Respondent made application to the Department of Real Estate of the State of

California for a real estate salesperson license.

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(CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS)

2.

On or about May 20, 1996, in the Municipal Court of West Los Angeles Courthouse Judicial District, County of Los Angeles, California, Case No. 95W05037, Respondent was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 484(a) (petty theft), a misdemeanor. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

3.

On or about March 26, 1997, in the Municipal Court of Torrance Courthouse Judicial District, County of Los Angeles, California, Case No. 7SB02417, Respondent was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 484(a) (petty theft), a misdemeanor. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

4.

On or about September 29, 1997, in the Municipal Court Court, Consolidated Fresno Judicial District, County of Fresno, California, Case No. 97905945-2, Respondent was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 487(a) (grand theft), a felony. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee

under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

5.

On or about May 5, 1998, in the Municipal Court of Long Beach Judicial District, County of Los Angeles, California, Case No. 8LL03536, Respondent was convicted of violating California Vehicle Code Section 14601.1(a) (driving with a suspended license), a misdemeanor. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

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On or about September 21, 2000, in the Municipal Court of Beverly Hills Judicial District, County of Los Angeles, California, Case No. 0BH01351, Respondent was convicted of violating California Vehicle Code Section 23152(b) (driving with a blood alcohol level of 0.08 percent or more), a misdemeanor. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

7.

On or about July 8, 2002, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 2WL12892, Respondent was convicted of violating California Vehicle Code Section 14610(a)(1) (displaying a suspended or fictitious driver's license), a misdemeanor. Said crime bears a substantial

relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

On or about June 4, 2003, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 3MT04665, Respondent was convicted of violating California Vehicle Code Section 14601.1(a) (driving with a suspended license), a misdemeanor. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

9.

On or about September 22, 2003, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 3SB06001, Respondent was convicted of violating California Penal Code Section 470b (displaying a driver's license with the intent of facilitating forgery), a misdemeanor. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

10.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted as alleged herein constitute cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under California Business and Professions Code Sections 475(a)(2), 480(a), and 10177(b).

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(FAILURE TO REVEAL CONVICTION)

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In response to Part D - Question 1 of his license application, to wit: "HAVE YOU EVER BEEN CONVICTED OF A MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY? CONVICTIONS EXPUNGED UNDER PENAL CODE SECTION 1203.4 MUST BE DISCLOSED. HOWEVER, YOU MAY OMIT MINOR TRAFFIC CITATIONS WHICH DO NOT CONSTITUTE A MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY," Respondent answered "Yes," and failed to reveal the conviction described in Paragraph 5, above.

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12.

Respondent's failure to reveal the conviction in his

license application constitutes knowingly making a false statement of material fact required to be revealed in said application, which is grounds for denial of the issuance of a license under California Business and Professions Code Sections 475(a)(1), 480(c), and 10177(a).

(PRIOR LICENSE APPLICATION DENIAL)

13.

On or about February 7, 2007, in case no. H-33163 LA and L-2006100115, the Commissioner of the Department of Real Estate adopted the Proposed Decision dated January 17, 2007, thereby denying Respondent's application for a real estate salesperson license. As more fully set forth in the Decision for the above-mentioned case, Commissioner of the Department of Real Estate established that grounds existed for the denial of Respondent's application under California Business and

Professions Code Sections 10177(b), 480(a)(1), 10177(a), and 480(c). 2 3 14. 4 The prior license action against Respondent as alleged in Paragraph 12, above, constitutes cause for denial of 5 Respondent's application for a real estate license under 6 7 California Business and Professions Code Section 10117(f). 8 These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code 9 of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of 10 11 the California Government Code. 12 WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the aboveentitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the 13 charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to 14 authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real 15 estate salesperson license to Respondent, JAHMALL B. ELLIS, and 16 for such other and further relief as may be proper under other 17 18 applicable provisions of law.
