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The Complainant, Robin Trujillo, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, for cause of Accusation against ABEL OCHOA-HERNANDEZ, a.k.a. Abel Hernandez Ochoa or

Abel Hernandez or Abel Ochoa ("Respondent"), alleges as follows:

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The Complainant, Robin Trujillo, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

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2.

rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the

Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license

California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate salesperson.

3.

On or about June 13, 2011, in the Superior Court of the State of California, Los Angeles County, in Case No. TAl16918, Respondent pled nolo contendere and was convicted for violation of Vehicle Code Sections 2800.2(A) (evading a peace officer: reckless driving), a felony, and 23152(A) (driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs), a misdemeanor. Respondent was sentenced to three years probation; 270 days in jail; and ordered to pay fines.

On or about January 3, 2011, in the Superior Court of the State of California, Los Angeles County, in Case No.

OFF03308, Respondent pled nolo contendere and was convicted for violation of Vehicle Code Sections 23152(A) (driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs) and 14601.5 (driving while license is suspended or revoked for refusing chemical test or driving with excessive blood alcohol), misdemeanors. For the Vehicle Code Section 23152(A) conviction Respondent was sentenced to 60 months probation, 96 hours in jail (or perform thirteen days of Cal Trans), and ordered to pay fines. In addition, Respondent was ordered to complete an 18-month licensed second-offender alcohol and drug education and counseling program. For the Vehicle Code Section 14601.5(A) conviction, Respondent was sentenced to 36 months probation and ordered to pay fines (or perform ten days Cal Trans).

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On or about May 18, 2010, in the Superior Court of the State of California, San Diego County, in Case No. S238482, Respondent pled guilty and was convicted for violation of Vehicle Code Section 23152(B) (driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs with 0.08% or greater), a misdemeanor, along with the special allegation of Vehicle Code Section 23578 (blood alcohol concentration was 0.15% or greater). Respondent was sentenced to five years probation, ordered to pay fines, ordered to perform ten days of community service, and ordered to complete a nine-month alcohol treatment program and a Mothers Against Drunk Driving program.

6.

These convictions, by their facts and circumstances, bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

7.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted constitute cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

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Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found

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to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to
     exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement
     of the case.
