The Complainant, Robin Trujillo, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California for cause of Accusation against DONNA LEE PLOUGH, a.k.a. Donna Lee Cartwright ("Respondent"), alleges as follows:

1.

The Complainant, Robin Trujillo, a Deputy Real Estate Commissioner of the State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

2.

Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code as a real estate broker.

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On or about December 1, 2011 in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. 1MP06132, Respondent pled nolo contendere and was convicted of violating California Vehicle Code Section 23152 (b) (driving under the influence with greater than .08 percent BAC) and California Penal Code Section 273A(B) (willful harm to a child), both misdemeanors. Respondent also admitted to a prior misdemeanor conviction in 2007 pursuant to Penal Code Section 1170.12(1)-(D) and 667(B)-(I), and 1170 (H)(3) in Case No. 7SY04711 for violation of California Vehicle Code Section 23152(b) (driving under the influence with greater than .08% blood alcohol content). Respondent was sentenced to 60 months summary probation; ordered to serve one day in county jail; ordered to pay fines and ordered to enroll in an 18 month licensed second offender alcohol and other drug and education counseling program.

4.

The conviction described in Paragraph 3, by its facts and circumstances, bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crime, of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3, constitutes cause under California

Business and Professions Code Sections 490 and 10177(b) for the

suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

6.

California Business and Professions Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the department, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement of the case.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all licenses and/or license rights under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code) of Respondent DONNA LEE PLOUGH, for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under applicable provisions of law.
