21	The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Deputy Real Estate
22	Commissioner of the State of California, makes this Accusation
23	in her official capacity.

From April 04, 1988 through August 20, 2012,

Respondent was licensed and/or had license rights under the Real

Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and

Professions Code as a real estate broker, License ID 00780031.

Respondent's real estate broker license expired on August 20,

2012. Respondent has renewal rights pursuant to Business and

Professions Code ("Code") section 10201. The Bureau of Real

Estate ("Bureau") retains jurisdiction pursuant to Code section

10103.

3.

Respondent's real estate broker license was previously suspended for 30 days with said suspension stayed for one (1) year in Bureau Case No. H-28017 LA.

## (Suspension of License by Another Agency)

4.

On or about November 5, 2012, the State Bar of California filed a Notice of Disciplinary Charges against Respondent in Case Nos. 12-0-10007 and 12-0-11215. On or about May 22, 2012, Respondent's license to practice law was suspended for 12 months, execution of the suspension was stayed, and Respondent was placed on probation for 24 months subject to certain terms and conditions including an actual suspension for the first 60 days of probation, taking and passing the

Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination, and payment of costs and restitution payments totaling \$12,500. Respondent admitted to violations of the following California Rules of Professional Conduct: Rule 3-110(A), 3-700(D)(2), 1-300(A), and 3-100(A). On March 6, 2013, an Order Entering Default was filed in State Bar Court Case No. 12-0-10007 and Respondent was enrolled as an inactive member of the State Bar of California pursuant to Code section 6007.

5.

Respondent's license to practice law was previously disciplined with a 12-month suspension and probationary period of 24 months in State Bar Court Case No. 01-0-4408, et al.

6.

The suspension of Respondent's license to practice law is cause under Business and Professions Code Section 10177(f) for suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law. Said acts, if done by a real estate licensee, would be grounds for the suspension or revocation of a California real estate license under Civil Code 2944.7, Regulations 2830-2834 of the Regulations of the Real Estate Commissioner, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations, and Code Sections 10085.6, 10145, 10177, subdivisions (d) and/or 10177(g).

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7.

Code section 10186.2, subdivision (a)(1)(C), requires that licensees report to the Bureau, any disciplinary action taken by another licensing entity or authority of California or of another state or an agency of the federal government, within 30 days of the disciplinary action.

8.

Respondent failed to report the disciplinary action described in paragraph 3, above, to the Bureau in violation of Code section 10186.2.

9.

Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

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1 WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be 2 conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon 3 proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary 4 action against all licenses and/or license rights of Respondent 5 EMEKA GODFREY OKAFOR ONWUALU under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 6 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code), for the 7 cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and 8 for such other and further relief as may be proper under other provisions of law. 9 10 Dated at Los Angeles, California Gelevier 11 12 13 14 Deputy Real Estate/Commissioner 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 Emeka Godfrey Okafor Onwualu CC; Maria Suarez 23 Sacto.

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
