**AMENDED ORDER GRANTING REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSE**

The Order Granting Reinstatement of License filed on September 21, 2017 in Case No. H-39665 LA, is amended Nunc Pro Tunc, as follows:

On February 12, 2016, in Case No. H-39665 LA, a Decision was rendered revoking the real estate broker license of Respondent effective March 9, 2016. The effective date was stayed, by separate order to March 18, 2016.

On March 23, 2017, Respondent petitioned for reinstatement of said real estate broker license, and the Attorney General of the State of California has been given notice of the filing of the petition.

I have considered Respondent's petition and the evidence submitted in support thereof. Respondent has demonstrated to my satisfaction that Respondent meets the requirements of law for the issuance to Respondent of an unrestricted real estate broker license and that it

2 NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent's petition for  
3 reinstatement is granted and that a real estate broker license be issued to Respondent if  
4 Respondent satisfies the following conditions within twelve (12) months from the date of this  
5 order:

- 6 1. Submits a completed application and pays the fee for a real estate broker license within  
7 the 12 month period following the date of this Order; and
- 8 2. Submits proof that Respondent has completed the continuing education requirements for  
9 renewal of the license sought. The continuing education courses must be completed either (i)  
10 within the 12 month period preceding the filing of the completed application, or (ii) within the 12  
11 month period following the date of this Order

12 If Respondent fails to meet the above requirements, and those of sections  
13 10150.6, 10153 and 10153.2 of the California Business & Professions Code, to qualify for the  
14 issuance of a real estate broker license, Respondent may be issued a real estate salesperson  
15 license if Respondent qualifies for, takes and passes the examination for a real estate salesperson  
16 license, submits a completed application and pays the required fee for a salesperson license  
17 within the 12 month period following the date of this order, and meets all of the other  
18 requirements for issuance of a real estate salesperson license, including but not limited to section  
19 10151 of the California Business & Professions Code.

20 This Order shall become effective immediately.

11 license if Respondent qualifies for, takes and passes the examination for a real estate salesperson  
12 license, submits a completed application and pays the required fee for a salesperson license  
13 within the 12 month period following the date of this order, and meets all of the other  
14 requirements for issuance of a real estate salesperson license, including but not limited to section  
15 10151 of the California Business & Professions Code.
