Accusation of Ronald R. Sarmiento

On or about January 6, 2014, in the United States District Court, Central District of California, Case No. SACR11-00252-JVS, Respondent pled guilty to and was convicted for violation of Title 18 of the United States Code Sections 1341 (mail fraud), 1343 (wire fraud), and 2(a) (aiding and abetting), felonies. Respondent was placed on 2 years of probation, including 8 months of home detention. In addition, Respondent was prohibited from employment in any position that requires licensing and/or certification by any local, state or federal agency without prior approval. Furthermore, Respondent was prohibited from engaging in any business involving loan programs, telemarketing activities, investment programs or any other business involving the solicitation of funds or cold-calls to customers without prior approval. These convictions bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitute cause under Sections 490, 10177(b), and 10177(j) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

5.

California Business and Professions Code Section 10106, provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.
