(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

On or about August 17, 2015, in the Superior Court of California, County of Orange, case no. 15HF0041, Respondent was convicted of violating California Vehicle Code section 23153(b) (driving with a blood alcohol level of 0.08 percent or more and causing bodily injury on another), a felony, with an enhancement pursuant to California Penal Code section 12022.7(a) (personally inflicting great bodily injury on another person). In part, Respondent was sentenced to serve 90 days in jail, 5 years of formal probation, and pay various fines and fees. This crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as described above, constitutes cause under California Business and Professions Code sections 490 and 10177(b) for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

(COSTS)

California Business and Professions Code section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the bureau, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement of the case.
