1	(CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS)
2	3.
3	On or about December 2, 2016, in the Superior Court of California, County of
4	Riverside, Case No. INF1601411, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code Section
5	245(a)(1) (assault with deadly weapon other than a firearm), a misdemeanor, Penal Code
6	Section 273.5(a) (inflict corporal injury on spouse/cohabitant, etc.), a misdemeanor, and Penal
7	Code Section 594(a)(2)(3) (maliciously damage property), a misdemeanor. Respondent was
8	placed on probation for thirty six (36) months and was ordered to serve two (2) days in county
9	jail. The terms of Respondent's probation require him to complete a fifty two (52) week
10	domestic violence program, perform twenty (20) hours of community service. Respondent was
11	also ordered to pay victim restitution, fees, and fines.
12	4.
13	The convictions described in Paragraph 3 bear a substantial relationship under
14	Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications,
15	functions, or duties of a real estate licensee.
16	5.
17	The convictions described in Paragraph 3 constitutes cause under Sections 490
18	and 10177(b)(1) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of
1,9	Respondent under the Real Estate Law.
20	(FAILURE TO REPORT CONVICTIONS)
21	6.
22	Pursuant to Section 10186.2 of the Code, a licensee shall report, in writing, "the
23	conviction of the licensee, including any verdict of guilty, or plea of guilty or no contest, of any
24	felony or misdemeanor" to the Bureau of Real Estate ("Bureau") within thirty (30) days of the
25	conviction. Respondent failed to report in writing to the Bureau the convictions described in
26	Paragraph 3 above, within thirty (30) days of the conviction date.

2	Respondent's failure to timely report the convictions constitutes cause under
3	Section 10186.2 of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of
4	Respondent under the Real Estate Law.
5	(INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT COSTS)

7	California Business and Professions Code Section 10106, provides, in pertinent
8	part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of
9	Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee
10	found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs
11	of the investigation and enforcement of the case.
12	WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the
13	allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing
14	disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent ANTHONY BRIAN
15	GUTIERREZ under the Real Estate Law for the cost of investigation and enforcement as
16	permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable
17	provisions of law.
